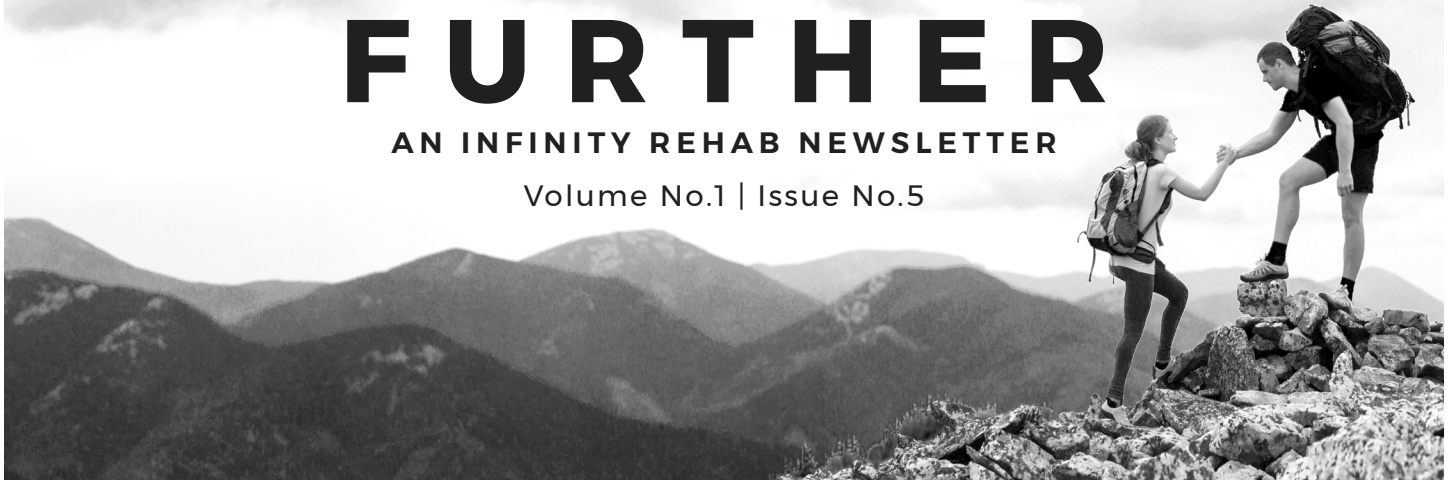

HHS RENEWS PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY DECLARATION

The federal government last week officially renewed the COVID-19 public health emergency declaration, which was originally issued on January 31 and renewed on April 21. The renewal was signed by Secretary Alex Azar, who also announced it on Twitter.

The renewal extends the waivers and flexibilities HHS has issued to respond to COVID-19.

CMS UPDATES DATA ON COVID-19 IMPACTS ON MEDICARE BENEFICIARIES

CMS released its first monthly update of data that provides a snapshot of the impact of COVID-19 on the Medicare population. For the first time, the snapshot includes data for American Indian/Alaskan Native Medicare beneficiaries. The new data indicates that American Indian/Alaskan Native beneficiaries have the second highest rate of hospitalization for COVID-19 among racial/ethnic groups after Blacks.



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
